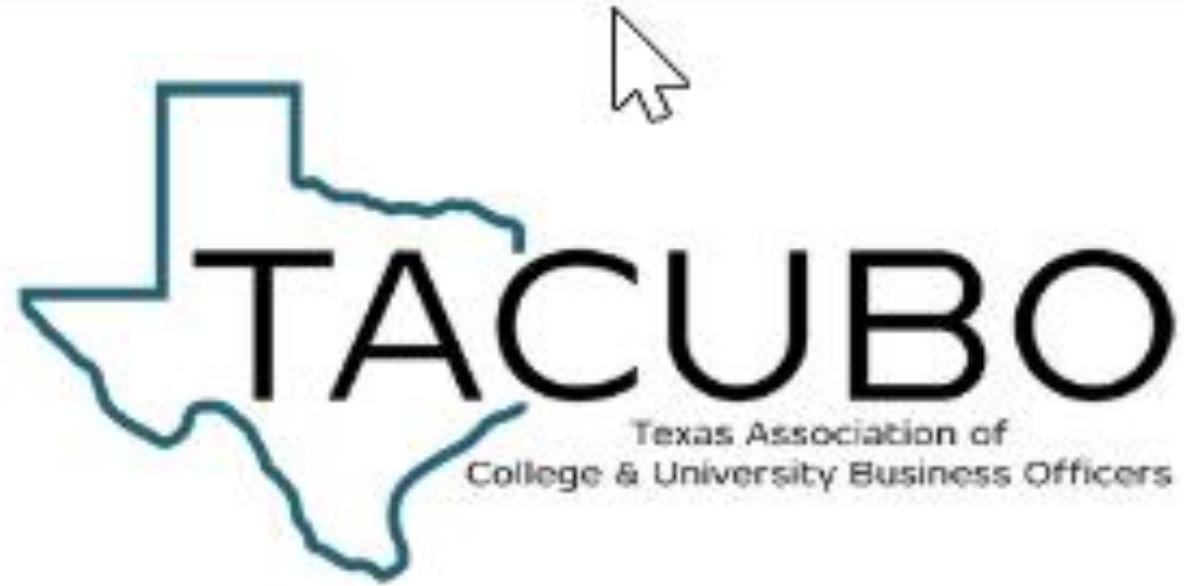

Legal Updates

United States of America v. Texas - case was filed on June 4, 2025, in the U.S. District Court, Northern District of Texas, Wichita Falls Division. The United States sued Texas seeking to invalidate the Texas Dream Act, which guaranteed all eligible Texas high school graduates, regardless of their immigration status, in-state tuition at Texas state higher education institutions.

House v NCAA – case involved Division I athletes who filed a class-action lawsuit against the NCAA, alleging that the organization improperly profited from the name, image, and likeness (NIL) of its athletes while restricting their ability to independently operate or contract with third parties. This was claimed to be a violation of antitrust laws . . . settlement permits the NCAA to allow schools to share up to \$20.5 million in revenue with student-athletes starting from the 2025-26 school year

USA v Texas Questions

1. Has the state or federal government provided any guidance or resources to help institutions navigate this change?

House v NCAA Questions

3. Who will be responsible for processing student payments (accounts payable, refunds through student system, etc.)
4. If a vendor, will the state warrant hold process prevent payments?
